PLANTING FOR THE FUTURE- GO NATIVE

The autumn is a great time for planting and landscaping your yard and gardens to enhance the beauty of Chatterleigh. The cooler days will certainly make the work conditions more pleasant. While Arbor Day, associated with planting trees, is in April, the months of September, October and even November are recommended for updating your landscape plan.

Experts report that fall is an opportune time for planting. The milder temperatures are advantageous for root growth and development. Water requirements are lower without the leaves on the tree. Planting this time of year permits growth of roots in both fall and again early spring, improving collection of water and nutrients for the future leaves. This may all increase your new plants chance of survival.

When choosing a specific shrub, tree or any plant, consider a native species. A native species is defined as "a species that normally lives and thrives in a particular ecosystem." A native plant is more likely to grow well because it has evolved over the years with the soil, climate, fauna and other members of the local plant community.

In our yard, we had to learn this lesson the hard way. When we moved into our new home in Brookview Farms 22 years ago, the builder planted a Bradford Pear or Pyrus Calleryana, a popular species of pear native to China and Vietnam. While it was fast growing, it was not a long-lasting tree. After 18 years in our front yard, it split apart and needed to be taken down. In our backyard, a nursery recommended a species of Zelkova, which is in the elm family but native to southwest and eastern Asia. We are planning to have this 22 year old tree removed as it has had 2 large sections split off from the trunk. If trees native to central Maryland had been planted initially, we would be enjoying the shade provided by mature trees, but instead we are starting over with small trees.

Maryland is divided into three eco-regions or "physiographic provinces". The three western counties are in the Mountain Region. The counties along the Chesapeake Bay and on the eastern shore are in the Coastal region. Here in central Maryland, including Baltimore County, we are in the Piedmont region. A reputable nursery or landscaper can provide lists of trees, shrubs and ground covers which would be native to the Piedmont area. Update on Limekiln Farms Development

The Board of Chatterleigh Association continues to have an open dialogue with Ray Jackson of Stonewall Capital, developer of the proposed Limekiln Farm. Mr. Jackson, his engineers from KCI Technologies, his lawyer and landscape architect met with the board at a special summer session on July 10. Here is a brief summary of some of the issues discussed.

Mr. Jackson reported that his company is working with a single respected national builder and hopes to have an executed contract soon. Once the builder is confirmed, he offered to have the builder come to another board meeting.

Due to community concerns about the placement of the entrance to the development on Cowpens Avenue, Mr. Jackson reported that he hired a traffic engineer to study the traffic on Cowpens Avenue to work with the engineers to design a safe entrance/exit to the development. He is working with the Baltimore County Division of Traffic Engineers to ensure all sight distances are proper and to conform to the AASHTO guidelines per the Baltimore County Code.

As recommended by the board's consultant, the three separate driveways leading to the three homes on the southeastern portion of the property will be combined into a single access road.

The landscape architect will be sending the board a list of the trees and shrubs chosen from the Baltimore County list of acceptable planting materials. All plantings for the final landscaping plan will come off this list. Board input was requested to suggest specific native Maryland species to be used. Unfortunately, due to the required sidewalk along the western side of Cowpens Avenue, it is expected that numerous large trees will be removed.

Mr. Jackson has solicited input from the Chatterleigh Association concerning the covenants which will govern the new development to assure consistency with the standards of the existing Chatterleigh neighborhoods. A board member is working to submit recommendations for this covenants document.

The Board was assured that once construction begins, possibly in the Winter or Spring of 2018, that there will be a contact person on-site for any neighbors concerns. All construction parking will be on the Limekiln property, not on the streets of Chatterleigh.

Before signing any contracts, be sure your application has been approved. Copies of all six original covenants are published on the Nextdoor Chatterleigh website and at Chatterleigh.org website. If you follow the correct procedure with the association, as outlined below, you could avoid unnecessary delays, fees or even possible court costs.
