TALMAR- Local, Organic, Therapeutic...and always in season

Many Chatterleigh neighbors have seen the name TALMAR or have driven by their sign off Cromwell Bridge Road near Cromwell Valley Park. I'll be the first to admit that, despite living less than ½ mile from their 10 acre farm property, I never knew their focus and mission.

TALMAR stands for Therapy Alternatives of Maryland. Its website states that the organization is "dedicated to the mission of enhancing health for all people of all ages and abilities." TALMAR offers an innovative, therapeutic, vocational and educational environment designed particularly for individuals with disabilities or chronic conditions that impact their health and well-being.

The programs offered at TALMAR cover a range of activities and options. Horticultural therapy uses plants and gardening to improve participant's well-being. Vocational training is offered to help individuals gain skills which can lead to employment in the agricultural or horticultural industries. Its curriculum provides both structured classroom and hands-on training.

Workshops on composting, building a raised bed, vertical gardening and beekeeping are examples of the type of information the organization is prepared to share. Varied events such as Movie Night, Kid's Day, Cut Your Own Flowers, and Wine Tasting were hosted in 2017. Keep an eye on this web address www.talmar.org/events for the upcoming 2018 schedule. In addition, anyone can stop by daily and purchase fresh organic chicken eggs (get the discount coupon on their website!) Likewise, fresh cut flowers are available for purchase seasonally.

At this time of the year, TALMAR is accepting enrollment in their 2018 CSA (Community Supported Agriculture). Fresh produce, herbs, and flowers, grown organically without pesticides, are available on a weekly basis for 20 weeks beginning the week of June 4, or in the fall of 2018 for 7 weeks beginning the week of October 22. You will get notices and recipes concerning your weekly order. Your participation helps strengthen and sustain this local farm while providing training and work for individuals with disabilities. Lastly, as it is located only 5-10 minutes away from Chatterleigh, why not consider being a TALMAR volunteer? Individuals are needed to plant seeds in a greenhouse, to grow or harvest produce and flowers in the fields, to help build raised beds, to make deliveries, and to help in the administrative offices. The Chatterleigh Association, Inc. which consists of six developments, must receive your applications PRIOR to ANY changes being made and before any application is filed with Baltimore County either for a variance or a permit. Before signing any contracts, be sure your application has been approved. Copies of all six original covenants are published on the Nextdoor Chatterleigh website and at Chatterleigh.org website. If you follow the correct procedure with the association, as outlined below, you could avoid unnecessary delays, fees or even possible court costs.
